Training and Supervision

- Trainings are held in Oakland (1st Tuesday) and in Petaluma (3rd Tuesday)
- There will also be 4th Tuesday experiential trainings / community meetings
- Weekly Group Supervision on days and times to be determined
 - Weekly Individual Supervision on days and times to be determined School Placement
- Minimum of two days at a school site based on school needs
- Individual and group counseling, mindfulness groups, classroom observations
